
Special Advisor pf ANSO Secretariat also gave speeches.




Prof. Dr. Atta ur Rahman, *FRS* **Received Highest Chinese Scientific** Award by the Chinese President in Beijing, China (January 10, 2020)

The President of China Xi Jinping has conferred the highest scientific award of China to the famous Pakistani Scientist, Prof. Dr. Atta-ur-Rahman in the Great Peoples Hall in Beijing on January 10, 2020.

Prof. Dr. Atta-ur-Rahman is the only Muslim Scientist who has been honored with the prestigious award of China International Science and Technology Cooperation. This award is conferred in recognition of his monumental contributions in the field of chemistry.

This top international award has previously been given to several leading scientists of the world including the Nobel Laureates, Dr. Carlo Rubbia (Nobel Prize in physics, 1984) and Dr. Zhores I. Alferov (Nobel Prize in physics, 2000). This award is an honor not only for the Pakistan Academy of Sciences but also for the entire nation.


This seminar was attended by a large of number students and faculty members of the university.



Prof. Dr. Syed M. Qaim, Foreign FPAS Published a Book entitled "Medical Radionuclide Production: Science and Technology"

Professor Dr. Dr. h. c. mult. Syed M. Qaim, a Foreign Fellow, PAS based at the University of Cologne, Research Centre Juelich, Germany, wrote a new book entitled "Medical Radionuclide Production: Science and Technology" and recently published by the traditional German Publisher De Gruyter, Berlin/Boston (ISBN-10: 3110601567). The work describes the production technology of standard medical radionuclides using reactors and cyclotrons for patient diagnosis and therapy.

A special focus lies on the science and technology involved in the development of novel metallic radionuclides for positron emission tomography (PET) and internal targeted radiotherapy. The availability of those radionuclides is opening up new potentials, especially in radio immunotherapy, theranostics and multimode imaging.



Obituary

Lt. Gen. Muhammad Saleem HI(M) (1937- 2019)

On December 24, 2019, Lt. General Muhammad Saleem, Fellow PAS left this world forever. He was born in New Delhi, British India in 1937. Dr. M. Saleem was one of the notable luminaries in the field of pathology and hematology in Pakistan served in different capacities like, Professor and Head Department of Hematology, Armed Forces Institute of Pathology, Rawalpindi, Consultant Hematologist, Riyadh Military Hospital, Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, Senior Registrar and Honorary Clinical Tutor, Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Surgeon General Army & Director General Medical Services (Inter-Services) etc. On retirement from Army, he took charge of National Institute of Health (NIH), Islamabad as the Executive Director from where he eventually retired after two years of spell in preventive medicine, serology and vaccines manufacturing.

Lt. General M. Saleem is the recipient of Hilal-i-Imtiaz (Military) from the Govt. of Pakistan and was elected as Fellow of the Pakistan Academy of Sciences in 1999. He will be missed by the PAS Fellows.
